Advanced Airway Management Skill Decay: A Review of the Literature

Airway management is a fundamental skill set expected of all anesthesia providers. Moreover, anesthesia providers are expected to be airway management experts. Airway management includes basic skills such as bagmask ventilation. Airway management also includes advanced skills such as laryngeal mask airway (LMA) insertion and endotracheal tube insertion (ETI) skills which are acquired during the anesthesia provider's educational program. Following anesthesia training, the employment paths of some anesthesia providers may lead to solo practice in ambulatory surgery centers and office-based practice locations where the anesthesia provider only administers moderate or deep sedation and rarely performs advanced airway management. For example, within the United States, gastrointestinal endoscopy centers frequently employ anesthesia providers to provide deep sedation for outpatient procedures using propofol. The goal for these cases is to maintain patient spontaneous respiration and avoid utilizing airways such as an LMA or an endotracheal tube. Therefore, maintaining competency in advanced airway management skills can be a challenge for anesthesia providers working in practice settings with low frequency in performing skills such as LMA insertion or ETI. Infrequent advanced airway management skill performance in these clinical settings can lead to skill decay.

BACKGROUND

Skill decay, also termed deskilling, is described in the literature as the gradual loss of acquired skills that occurs through infrequent practice or extended periods of skill nonuse. A significant factor that influences decay in the proficiency of a skill or skill retention over extended periods of nonuse is the retention interval. The retention interval is defined as the duration of time that a particular skill is not used or practiced. The authors determined that the longer the retention interval after skill acquisition and the longer the period of skill nonuse, the greater the degree of skill decay.

<u>Additional Instructions</u>

Recordings should be completed in a quiet environment on the applicant's mobile device. Start the recording by stating the article title, "written by...", "narrated by [Your name], [Your School], "Class of [Graduation Year]". Then state the publication name ("AANA Journal") and issue ("June 2024"). Then narrate the body of the text. In preparing your audio sample, it will be helpful to listen to sample audio narrations circulated to subscribers to get a sense of the pace and tone we are looking for.
